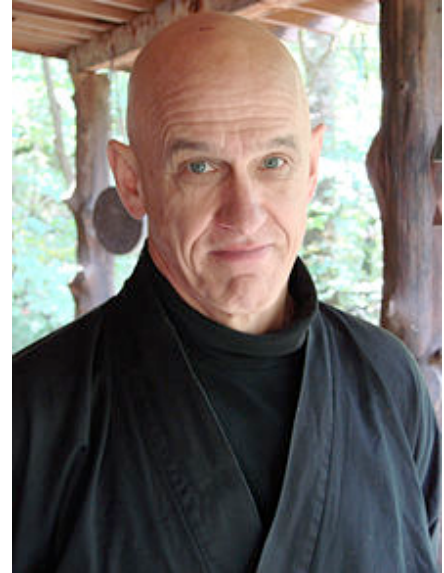


**Tallahassee Buddhist Community

Zen Master George Bowman
(*Bo Mun Soen sa Nim*)**

George Bowman is a highly regarded and internationally known Zen Master. He has a special connection to many Buddhists in Tallahassee. His visits here began in 1992 when he received Dharma transmission from his teacher Seung Sahn. He has been a popular and inspiring teacher for this community since that time.

He was a founding member of the Providence Zen Center in 1972; he was resident teacher at the Cambridge Buddhist Association from 1991 to 1999. The list of the Masters that he has worked with includes: Shunryu Suzuki; Soen sa Nim; and Taizan Maezumi. . His current teacher is Kyozan Joshu Sasaki Roshi, Mt Baldy Zen Center, CA.

Bo Mun's teaching is deeply rooted in the teachings of Buddha and the Patriarchs and in this moment. During sesshin, he presents teisho, spoken teaching, ~45 min/day, reading from a passage from Dogen, Rinzai, Mumonkan or another authority and passing back and forth from text to the events of our lives.
